

Watch for these warning signs.

- Heavy bleeding
- Feeling dizzy or fainting
- Eye problems (blurry vision, double vision, loss of vision)
- Pain or bleeding where the shot was given (your arm or hip)
- Shortness of breath or coughing blood
- Sudden severe headache that won't go away
- Feeling weak or numb on one side of your body
- Sharp, sudden pain in your leg, chest or belly

Remember

Tell any health care provider that you visit that you are on birth control.

A health care provider is a doctor, nurse, hospital, clinic or anyone who gives you medical care.

If there is any change in your medical information (like a new medicine you are taking) tell the Adagio Health Staff or any other health care provider.

The shot does not protect against HIV or any other STD (sexually transmitted disease). An STD is a disease that you can get from having sex. Condoms can help keep you safe from some STDs including HIV.
